Christmas Tree



The families prepare Christmas cards to their relatives and friends. The first card appeared in 1843. Sir Henry Cole invented it. One side of the card was a short greeting and another – a nice picture. Soon these cards became very popular.

Candles



One of the Christmas traditions is a wreath with candles. It consists of 5 candles: 4 red and one of them is white. Every Sunday one of them is burnt. The white candle is burnt in the evening before Christmas as a symbol of light and life.

Christmas Carols



People sing carols in the streets and churches. The word «carol» means a round dance. Often the carolers dance in the street round the tree in the park. One of the most famous carols is «Silent Night».
